REPAIRS At the present time new waterways and stoke out in the upper course all forward aft on both sides - Plank up above the floor head on each side inside 2 New half Beams - new waterways - Thick stoke in upper course sufficient to receive the doubling as for margin - Doubled thence up with six stokes of 2 1/2 all through treenailed and bolted to the bottom studding - Caulked keel up over all and recoppered as before -

In 1841 Quoining Keels & Spirketting forward, Wale & Counter keelson from chain chest aft several planks shifted forward below the wale & P-eking forward over the new upper deck and in the beam -

When course doubled & the bottom sheathed with inch Fir over Patent *[Handwritten mark]*
