## REPAIRS

Copper stripped off, hung, two iron stakes of sheathing taken off, hull seam & border end caulked, the thrust bolts in the lodging knees & the bolts in the side arm of the hanging knees & the deck beams renewed, & an additional pair of iron hanging knees abreast of the Foremast, three new stations, and the Wates & upperworks caulked & sheathed with yellow metal, Several treenails driven out for examination and found in good condition as well as the planks through which they pass, the waterways, beams, house timbers, knight head, breasthooks, transoms, floors, keelsons, planking outside & inside, frame as here seen, Decks & comings are all in a very good & good condition, the keel is straight and has preserved her original form & shear
