REPAIRS At the present time. 13 planks Starboard side & 12 planks Larboard side, aft removed - Two Transoms. One Half Transom, one Transom below the Ruff port - Two Fashion pieces on each side, Inner Post Head of Middle Stern Post shifted together with several planks of the Counter - The Rudder & Runk refitted - part of the Fore Drift shifted - New Cheeks, House Bolsters refitted - New Galleries & Quarter Pieces - Channels refitted - Caulked from the Copper up -

The Bolts and Screws are sound and good, as also are the planks through which they pass - the waterways, beams, House Timbers, Knight Heads, Breast Hooks, Floors, Kelsons, Planking outside from the Copper upwards, the Ceiling inside, the Frame & inner surface of the outside planking where it can be seen, the decks and Cunnings - The keel is straight & the stern unaltered
