REPAIRS at present the fore piece of keel having been found decayed has been renewed - Stern damaged the false keel has been renewed and a new false stern post fitted & all the timbers banded on the post refitted - The bottom stripped and the treenails renewed from the bilge to the new upper Courses many in shores Caulked to the top of the keels & bottom sheathed with 4 metal on felt -
