REPAIRS Having been on shore on the House and on her passage from St Michaels has had the bottom shipped. hung in shores, caulked from the keel to the wales and the waterways, rep<sup>d</sup> cutwater, windlass overhauled & new lining, new horse pipe and all damages repaired, and sheathed with Yellow Metal over paper.
