REPAIRS now done of damages sustained by being on the stocks in China Sea. The whole of the Floor Plate renewed. The Ship hung in Staves and Caulked from Masts to Mast. Yellow Metal stripped off and renewed. Plank hangings and Ring Plates refastened.

Repairs not of damage. Three Pairs of Iron Plates now added to Middle Deck Beams. 12 Bolts in old hanging knees renewed. Stern and Star Deck additionally Bolted. Knees and Beams mended up.
