The Lower Stake of Water Fore and Aft on each side new, the Shelf and Knee Bolts in way of it, also a Plank in the 's Stake of Water Fore of American Oak. Three After Hoods and one Fore Hood on each side of Bottom next below Water new.

The Water and Bottom now Caulked and the Bottom Sheathed with Yellow Metal upon Felt.
