REPAIRS

The transoms and other timbers of the stern frame are not in a good condition. The head of the stern post has a suspicious appearance. Several of the Hold Beams & knees are old worn and not in the most efficient condition. The butts of the waterways are open & filled up, and the waterway beams are large.
