Built The four Stakes of Topside from after part of Main Channel to  
 Stern of East India Dock also a Forehead of Upper Black Stakes,  
 one House Timber and thirteen fillings betwixt timbers in the  
 above space of English Oak.

Scrapped The four Stakes of Topside to near Fore part of Main Channel  
 of East Dock, 120 feet in two upper Stakes of Wales and 70 feet in two Black  
 Stakes now under Fore Channel of Dantier Dock, Built & East Dock; one  
 House Timber and twelve fillings also two Top Timbers in way of  
 the above of English Oak; both Head Boards and Cheeks off and on again  
 Caulked outside above Copper
