This Vessel had extensive repairs and the upper works were scraped bright and bolt and trunnions overhauled and partly renewed in Dec. 1846 as stated in Mr. Martins report of that date which please see - at present she has been laid up and the state of the bottom examined - the Keelson has been trunnioned over and a new Middle Piece fitted of English oak and a hog Keelson bolted & fitted from main to forestep - The deck watertight & sheerstrakes Caulked - The Sheer and general form of the Vessel appear unaltered
