REPAIRS

Now done. The Yellow Metal Sheathing stripped off, Ship hung in Shores Caulked from upper edge of Black Stake down to Keel, about a dozen Treennails in upper course renewed. The Bottom from Wales to Keel Sheathed with Fir one Inch thick upon Felt, and Yellow Metal Sheathing over them, the Stake of Deck next the Waterway on Poop, and the Planks here on Forecastle renewed.
