REPAIRS At the present time six pair of Iron hanging knees to the deck beams and six pair to the hold beams, both in the shell examined & several shifted, upper course of bottom sheathed with inch boards over felt, caulked from the Copper to the gunwale, put in & purchased fixed to the windlass, and a general overhaul.
