REPAIRS From having been ashore near New York on the Coast of Holland during her late Voyage where she was temporarily repaired she has now undergone the following Extra Expenses - Yellow Metal stripped off new fore piece of Main Keel New lower stem and grizee new gun board strakes - New brass dove tailings Main and steer Kelsons removed except afterlings - Ceiling lifted from Kelsons to 2 fathoms heads except after steaks laid woodings - 22 new floor timbers <sup>13x19 inches</sup> fitted of New England Oak or sound second hand timber (2 inches sides & shoulders larger than old timber had been) 26 new port futtocks 12 filling timbers 54 head & heel chocks renewed of new or sound second hand English oak timber - New main & star Kelsons fitted of sole India teak from Main Head forward this bottom with 4 metal 500 feet of slack 600 feet of 6 inch 100 feet of 3 Pecking <sup>13x19</sup> Per ft over

brewnails renewed thro' New Ceiling 190 Yellow Metal bolts driven  
in bilge planks and timber strakes - New steps to fore & main masts  
lower breast hook refitted - hold pillars refitted. Rungs in shores  
caulked from the keel to the wales and bottom deck sheathed with yellow  
metal on felt - an entirely new rudder fitted with new lower  
and upper rudder bands - Hause Chocks removed then hause  
pipe fitted on Starb<sup>d</sup> side, & chock replaced New head sail, with  
new figure head and lacing fitted - wales topsides and sheer  
scrapped bright and planed over and moulding renewed about 200 ft.  
of topside planks shifted in the way of ports and scuttles - timbers  
exposed perfectly sound - New sheerstrakes rough tree staves  
and plank shears to port New stern <sup>planks</sup> and new quarter galleries -  
entirely new poop deck of yellow pine interior and front of poop also
