REPAIRS Having been on shore in Dorset Straits, had at Calcutta 1849 Eighty six feet of new keel, new garboard stake on both sides, all the flat of the floor additionally through bolted, caulked from the keel to the gunwale, sheathed with inch fir over a chunam & Poppo.

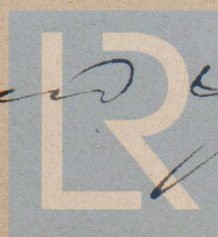
