REPAIRS Two midship piece of keelson 20 feet of beam, scraped bright several bolts & beenails driven out for examination & found in good condition, caulked from the keel to the gunwale & sheathed with Yellow Metal over felt

The plank sheers, waterways, beams, haire timbers, knighthead, breasthooks, transoms, floors, keelson, planking outside & inside are all in a sound & efficient state, the keel is straight & her shear & form appear to have preserved its original state
