REPAIRS at Quebec in June 1851 having received damage in the ice and
new stem & catwater, several planks shifted round the bows about
850 feet, & new sheathing on the bottom round the bows about 2000 feet
At the present time 42 bths renewed on the sides & hanging fences
sheathing additionally nailed, caulked from the lower part of the
soles to the waterways & 22 feet of new sheer stake
