Outside Stalk<sup>s</sup>. 150 feet of Sheer Stakes new of African Oak,  
 Part side 120 feet of Sheer Stakes, of African Oak, and English Oak,  
 one Plank of Topside Head Piece & two Fair Boards of Male English Oak.

Timbers in way of the above Planting not seen by us, but 'tis Reported that eighteen Rollings were introduced on each side of African Oak from 4<sup>ft</sup> to 5<sup>ft</sup> long. 25 ft of Plank sheer on the Part side new. The whole of Deck from raised 3<sup>rd</sup> of 5<sup>th</sup> new of 5 Yellow Pine: Caulked above Yellow Metal Sheathing.
