REPAIRS

At the present time under Special Survey Rule Sec 60 with a view to retaining her present ~~st~~ character.

The Outside Planking from lower part of Wales upwards scraped bright (the Planking from light water mark to Wales having been searched in 1852 when newly sheathed with Y.M. the Committee have excused its being stripped for the present survey) Iron Bolts driven out for examination.

Upper Deck Clamp repaired, a Breast Hook added between Decks and one in the Hold of East India Stab, all outside Planking of Poop new of Baltic Red Pine, all outside Planking of Forecastle new of English Oak, and Caulked from lower part of Wales upwards including the Decks. Several new Top Timbers abeam of Poop & Forecastle.

The Decks, Coamings, inside and outside Planking their Bolts and Trunnels, Planks their Waterways, Hooks, Beams, Knees, Upper & Lower Deck Bolts, Knight Heads, Haulse Timbers, Transoms, Kelson and Timbers of the Frame where they may be seen have been examined and appear to be in good condition.
