## REPAIRS

Having at the special request of Mess<sup>rs</sup> Cooper & Nephew examined this vessel on the Inst<sup>t</sup> for the purpose of being reported to the Committee for reclassing upon the asterisk - finding the outside planking not free from defect & its general appearance unsatisfactory the following notice was given "the outside planking from light water line to Waterways be scraped bright and thereafter examined in dry dock before being reported to the Committee for Classification on the Reg<sup>r</sup> Book on any character"
