Now done in accordance with the Rules (Section 54) the vessels sides have been scraped bright from the light water mark to the waterway seam, Treennails and bolts have been driven out for survey, and found in good condition.

"The upper or main deck and comings, the upper and lower deck bolts, and the outside planking through which they pass, the Planksheers, waterways, and beams, so far as they can be examined, the hawse timbers, knight-heads, breasthooks, and transoms, the floors and keelsons, the keel and rudder, the planking outside, and the trenails passing through from the light water mark upwards, the ceiling inside, and the frame and inner surface of the outside planking where it can be seen appear in good condition, and the sheer and general form of the ship unaltered."
