REPAIRS now done, the vessel's sides scraped bright in accordance with the Rules, Section 54, Trunnels and bolts drawn out for survey - The following renewed, viz - The fore and after piece of keelson with Iron Bars, and all the Hay keelson with Iron Bars, excepting the after piece of Stringy Bars; the Main Mast and Main Topmast new - The timber strake bolted with Yellow Metal this' bolts. -

The upper deck and Comings the upper and lower deck bolts, the planks this which they pass, planks here, waterways, beams, house timbers, knight heads, breasthooks, transoms, keel and rudder, floors and keelson, ceiling, planking outside, and the trunnels passing this from the light water mark upwards all appear in good Condition.
