**REPAIRS**

This vessel was first seen on Gilberts Gridiron we went the next day to survey her and found that she had been removed and could not ascertain where she was - on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of August we found her in the St Katharines Dock and finding that a new fore keelson had been fitted afloat we sent the following Notice Card recommending "that the new piece of keelson which is not fastened in accordance with the Rules be through fastened" before she reported to the Committee to retain her character in the Register book -
