Yellow Metal sheathing stripped off, and the outside plankings dubbed bright from light water mark to metal line and Treennails driven out for inspection which were found good inside bilge plank pieces where required, caulked from upper part of bilges to keel, new and old caulking tested and found good. - resheathed with Yellow Metal over felt
