Yellow metal sheathing (put on in '58) stripped off, new false keel new main piece of Rudder of English Oak, Rudder case most part new, vessel hung in shores recultured from keel to metal line & unmetalled on feet as before.

Draw attention to the present opportunity offered for the examination of upper courses of bottom as preliminary to survey for continuation, which has been declined.
