REPAIRS

In consequence of dry rot -

On the starboard side, ten long and seventeen short, and on the port side nine long and fourteen short top timbers, the fashion timber on each side and three transoms also one rough-tree timber renewed with English Oak - On starb'd side, the planks sheer from the fore part of the fore channel to the raised quarter deck renewed with Teak; one midship length of sheerstrake three in the next strake below, and two in each of the three next strakes renewed with Teak, two planks in the upper strake of wales, three in the second and two in the third and fourth renewed with 5 inch pitch pine, twelve planks on the starboard buttock new of Baltic oak and pitch pine. Two lengths of starboard waterway of English Oak and Teak, Deck hook, king and quid piece new of English Oak - On Port side, fifty six feet of plankstar one midship plank of sheerstrake, two in each of the four strakes below and one in the next strake renewed with Teak and greenheart two planks in the upper two in the second and one in the third strake of wales new of pitch pine, ten planks on buttock new of Baltic oak.

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Port side cont'd. one piece of bow waterway of English Oak, two midship pieces of U.D. Clamp, two of second strake and two in each strake of 'tween deck ceiling of pitch pine two pieces of L.D. plirkettina and two of L.P. Clamp of Baltic oak - Starboard side, the same of upper deck Clamp and 'tween deck ceiling renewed as on port side of pitch pine, three planks of L.D. Clamp of Baltic Oak. On Starboard bow seven bold cant timbers with four chocks new of English Oak the fore heads of ceiling from the fourth plank of ceiling below the hold beams renewed with Baltic Oak & English Oak, three lower hold beams renewed with Baltic Oak four upper deck beams and five half do. new of the same - mast partners &c to main mast after hatch carlings and coming renewed. The whole of the main deck from raised quarter deck forward renewed with 3 inch Yellow Pine fastened with yellow metal bolts. An inner waterway worked in midships on each side of Pitch Pine, the whole of the fastenings in way of new work renewed with materials of same grade as the original - The treenails above the metal line from the old plirkettina renewed with Australian wood - The fore main and foretop chain bolts on the starboard and the fore and main on the Port side renewed. Starboard fore channel renewed. The yellow metal sheathing off the vessel recalked throughout, thoroughly saffed, all the new timber payed with Copperas water - and resheathed with yellow metal upon Felt.

Added; Four pairs of hanging knees to upper deck beams.
