REPAIRS *Now done*, the yellow metal sheathing stripped off the bottom, the ship hung in shores, the wood sheathing removed from the keel seams, wood ends, and from where the clanking the shores for hanging the ship came, the bottom at these places caulked. Sheathing made good; and after driving out some bolts for examination which proved quite good, the wood sheathing has been raised four strokes, the bottom has been resheathed with yellow metal on the wood sheathing. the after length of false keel has been refitted and the main beam lengthened six feet -

We were called upon to survey her for damage but did not find that she had sustained any of consequence -
