REPAIRS

I was called upon to examine this vessel to ascertain if she were fit for the Black Diphthong Class.

An examination found the buttocks wormed, the Nelson and Ceiling very defective, and a plank in the larboard Quarter decayed - the Treennails in the topsides slack and doubtful -
