# REPORT of SURVEY for REPAIRS.

No. 206 Survey held at London Date 10<sup>th</sup> Nov 62 1862  
on the B<sup>n</sup> Persia Master Chetwynd

## REPAIRS

The vessel caulked from keel to plank sheers, two strakes of doubling wrought iron and aft bent to plank sheers of iron bark from thence down diagonally doubled <sup>in felt</sup> with two inch American elm, the bolts in riders and hooks below the hold beams renewed this the doubling with yellow metal and all the other deck and knee bolts renewed with iron, about every third plank of the doubling in midships passes thro' the keel, as the keelson bolts would admit the rest of the fastenings of the doubling are gym dumps below hold beams and galvanized iron above, the doubling caulked, and the caulking tested.
