## REPAIRS

At the request of the Owner I called at this Vessel on the 25<sup>th</sup> ult., and again on the 26<sup>th</sup> and left notice card to "renew some of the defective ceiling, and prepare her for further survey." Called again on the 28<sup>th</sup> and subsequently and found them repairing it badly. Wrote the Owner and saw him afterwards at the office and understood from him he was anxious to get the ship away and that the repairs could be done on the voyage. Was at the dock early the next morn and found she had hauled off.

Finding the Ceiling planks are not being put in as they should be viz in a workmanlike and efficient manner and some timbers were now exposed very soft and defective in the above vessel.
