REPAIRS now done, viz: - The Yellow Metal Sheathing, stripped off, the keel re-caulked from keel to metal line, together with the Main, Lower & Poop decks, and the hulls of Main deck waterways, and the bottom resheathed with Yellow Metal on Felt.

The Windlass unhung, stripped, and the main piece renewed with East India Teak, and fitted with a new 4 1/2 inch Iron through spindle; - and the Hawse pipe on port bow renewed.

The Middle line chand for and aft, the limbers lifted, and the Masts, &c, tested.

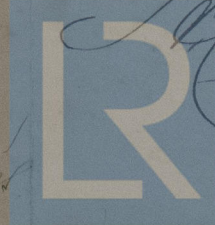
