REPAIRS

Repaired Yellow metal sheathing. Bolts have not now been drifted out, the same having been done when the vessel underwent the Biennial survey so recently as June 1866, but the general appearance is satisfactory, no signs of straining or weakness being visible, and the Yellow metal sheathing being very free from wrinkling.
