This vessel after encountering very heavy weather accompanied with adverse winds, for two or three days, in the Downs, sprung a leak; the Pumps becoming choked with part of the Cargo, viz. Coal-dust; she put back; when it was found that she after raft-port leaked, also a leak was discovered at the upper Rudder brace, both have now been effectually secured; also the Pumps drawn, cleared, and lower part repaired. &c.

Part of the Cargo was discharged to effect the above repairs.
