### REPAIRS

Now done:- The Yellow metal sheathing patched -  
but listings, 3 1/2 ins wide, out of the outside planking, in the following  
places, on both sides; viz:- One in each Bow, in the upper &ale  
Strakes, 14 feet long; One in each Bow in the upper course of Bottom  
12 feet long; One in the Wale, amidships, 14 feet long; One in the  
upper course of Bottom amidships 14 feet long; One on the  
Quarters just above the metal line 14 feet long; and one in the  
upper course of Bottom, right aft, about 12 ft long; The Timbers  
where thus exposed, are in good condition -  
Drifted out about 1/2 a dozen Greenails of the Bottom,  
for inspection, and found them good -  
faulked from the metal line to the Plank sheers -
