REPAIRS

The ceiling in this vessel has been lifted at a number of places for examination, with a view to her class being raised to the 17 A 1 grade; wherever she could be seen she proved in excellent condition -

It will be seen on reference to the original Report that this vessels materials are equal to the highest grade. In some parts the scantlings are slightly deficient but in my opinion they are more than compensated by the excess of strength in the adjacent parts. I beg therefore respectfully to recommend to the favourable consideration of the committee for an extension of term -
