# REPORT of SURVEY for REPAIRS.

REPAIRS Now done.

Sighted bottom the yellow metal patched, caulked the butts of topsides and wales, the waterway seams and round beamings &c. to upper deck; also the Poop and Forecastle decks, and round stanchions &c. &c. to ditto.

Limber lifted all fore and aft, peaks and rings much lumbered with ballast &c.

Renewed the main mast with Oregon pine, and the Fore topgallant yard with spruce; also renewed the steering wheel.
