## REPAIRS Now done.

Sighted bottom, the Yellow Metal patched and payed with "Peacocks" patent paint.  
Timbers lifted all fore and aft; the wings and fore peak much lumbered with ballast &c.  
Caulked from metal line over all, also the lower Deck.  
Renewed a few bolts in the knees to upper Deck.  
Refitted the pumps, Rigging, &c; and Renewed the Fore Yard, and fore lower topsail Yard, the main topgallant Yard, and Mizzen Gaff with Red-pine.
