REPAIRS

Examined the yellow metal sheathing which was put on at Liverpool towards the end of last year, where she had some other repairs. — Now done scraped the outside planking bright from the metal line upwards, including the planksheers and waterways; drifted out treenails, and chain plate bolts. Split out a stake above the wales from both sides the ship, fore and aft with the exception of one plank at each end, which were renewed in Decr. — Split out a short plank from each butts, a 4 in's listing on each side at the turn of the bilge, all fore and aft. lifted the timbers open'd the air courses, bored the beam ends, they proved (teak) sound. — The frame timbers where exposed also proved sound and good, with but two exceptions aft. unlung the windlass. stripped off the linings, and refitted it (finding the main piece satisfactory), lifted the chain cables from the lockers, found them sufficient in size and quantity.

General Observations and Opinion,

This vessel was surveyed for continuation under the 1st Survey Rule in 1864, when the metal was stripped, the upper course of bottom brightened and the bottom re-treenailed; — all the requirements of the 2nd Survey Rule which were not complied with at the above date have now been fully carried into effect. The frame timbers has been renew'd with Seak, likewise the two buttock planks, renew'd nearly the whole of the trenails in the topsides and some in the wales with stringy barte, five lengths of deck planks on the Port side towards the fore end. Three on the Starb^d renew'd with Seak, cut out some defects from a floor aft, and in one of the buttocks on each side, let in pieces, and introduced a pair of diagonal rider strg as compensation, together with some extra bolts, and made all good.

Litted a pair of iron Knees to one of the hold beams, at the after part of vessel, and bolted all with yellow metal through bolts. -

A new taffrail fitted with knees, and all in connection, made good
Spannle to steering wheel, warping chocks &c.

Rebolted the main Yough tree tail.

Cauked from the yellow metal upwards, together with the planks he four seams out on each side, the new deck planks, round the bitts, and hatches. -

Cut out a defective hollow place found in the fish of (Seak) forecastle, Starb^d and made all good and efficient, and gave her a new fore yard, overha and put the rigging in order.
