REPAIRS, &c. Now done.

The Yellow metal sheathing stripped off the bottom; the strake of deck plank next the waterway, on each side of the ship, renewed with yellow pine; the vessel caulked from keel to Waterway seams inclusive, together with two seams of the upper deck on each side; and the bottom resheathed with yellow metal on felt. -
