New main and inner stempost, upper piece of deadwood, and after piece of keelson, all of Teak. New stern-knee, also one cross-chock and one floor aft, all of English Oak. Keelson and ports through yellow metal bolted - diam. $1\frac{3}{8}$.

Seven after hoods renewed on starboard side aft, and four on port, also five planks in ceiling on starboard side aft, and six on port, all of Pitch-pine.

All cutches over new work refastened with yellow metal of larger size.
