At the present time the vessel placed in dry dock the yellow metal stripped off the bottom and the planking (doubling) under it examined in anticipation of continuation survey next year, and found good. No fastenings worn out. Caulked from keel to top of Wales and yellow metalled or felt 15 ft up.
