REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE in Annual Survey

Vessel placed in dry dock. The three upper strakes of metal sheathing stripped off on both sides and the seams of planking caulked thereat. Metal sheathing patched elsewhere. Bowspit lifted, knifed heads caulked - and cheeks to head knees renewed.

Vessel surveyed with ballast lying in hold under the main hatchway.

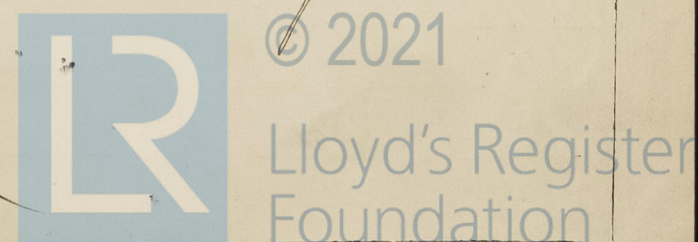
