REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE

Cause of Repairs to be clearly stated.

This vessel was docked with a view to undergo survey number 1 for a raised section 60. Planks were removed on the topsides, and bow and buttocks on each side; a strake of ceiling at Helges on each side at foreheads, and the required listings cut at the ends of the vessel. The examination was then made when it was found that several of the top timbers on each side were more or less defective, some frames aft on the starboard side as well as port side. The deck has been clouted and some beam ends were also defective. Some ceiling in the hold and forenoon deck also requires to be renewed. These defects were pointed out to Mr. Ditchburn, the Owner's Manager and he requested that the survey may be suspended until he had consulted with Messrs. Scrutton. No instructions.
