General Observations, Opinion as to Class, &c. The bottom has been examined and coated. Two rudder braces and three pintles renewed. The main topgallant mast renewed. The boats require repairing - the Master was written to in reference to the same, and the Owner has informed me that instructions have been given to the Carpenter to repair the boats at once. In other respects she appears to be in good and efficient condition and eligible to remain as classed. The vessel has gone to sea.


