This vessel has now been placed in Dry Dock the bottom examined and recoated with paint, the timber boards and ceiling equal to one stroke fore and aft on each side removed, examined and found good, the spars examined and the Anchors and general equip-ment attended to, fitform renewed, the rudder lifted and bushed, a Kedge Anchor 5.2.0 tested to 7.16.1.0 at River Wear by J. Hartness 19/11/83 now supplied.

The Freeboard as assigned by the Committee has now been marked and painted on the sides and verified.
