*At the present time the vessel placed in the dry dock the bottom scraped and coated. The timbers and ceiling equal to 3 and more strikes taken up on both sides examined and found good, and the cement adhering firmly to the iron except where worn which has been thickened and mended, excepting about thirty three feet in width of Main Hatch which cargo prevented being done, and allowed by the Committee to be done on her arrival out at Calcutta & to be examined by the Society's Surveyors there. The Windlass unhung and lining stripped, Chain cables ranged and examined. The Society's Freeboard now put on.*
