REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE Special Survey No 3.

At the present time the vessel was in the dry dock. The bottom cleaned, examined and coated.

All the close ceiling in the lower hold taken up and the oxidation stripped and beaten off and examined and found in the best condition and no drilling of plating required.

The chain cables have been hauled from the locker (to take the ceiling up) and ranged for examination and found like new chains being so well taken care of 270 fathoms.

The cement adhering firmly to the iron and has been thickened where worn. The floors and angles in bottom coated with cement wash, and other parts painted. Ceiling Relaid.
