Hartness Superintendent Sunderland *8th Dec^r 1880* weight ex. stock of the other bower anchor *35-0-0* proof strain *32-7-2-0* J. Hartness Sup^t Sunderland *13th Sept^r 1883*. The former bower anchor was supplied in lieu of one, the shank of which had been bent. The other bower anchor was supplied to satisfy the Rules as to weight.
