REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE *Part S.S. No 3*
This vessel has now been placed in dry dock & the bottom cleaned & recrated

The fore peak was cleared out & all the ceiling removed therefrom & this part cleaned & recrated

The madder has now been rebushed, the masts & spars examined & put, with the equipment generally into good condition, new fore & main topgallant masts being supplied.

In the main hold the ceiling hatches, which form the greater part of the close ceiling, have been lifted when the iron work cement &c were found to be in good condition

The whole of the close ceiling in the main hold is to be lifted, on the vessels return from her present voyage, to complete the S.S. No. 3.
