REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR Condition & Freeboard.

This Vessel has been examined in the West India dock, and afloat in the West India docks. It was alleged that she had been aground in Spencer's Kelf on the 7th Decr 1887 whilst on her voyage from Mauritius to Port Augusta, but no damage appeared to have been sustained. The bottom has been cleaned & painted. The rudder has been lifted and rebushed.

New solid hatchways 3 ins. thick have now been fitted to the hatchways together with new fore- & afters.

The freeboard assigned by the Committee, viz. - 3' 6" in winter, 3' 5" in salt water and 4 ins. less in fresh water has now been marked upon the Vessel.

Three new boats have been supplied, and also a new 10 inch Coir towline.

The masts, yards &c. have been examined and the following renewed, viz.:-

Fore topmast, main topgallant mast, and main topmast trussel trees and cross trees, and the main yard, fore lower topsail yard and spanker gaff have been repaired.
