REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR *Damage Repairs.*

*This vessel has been examined in the Union Dry Dock, and in consequence of damage sustained through collision with the S.S. "Hispania" on the 25<sup>th</sup> Aug. 1888 at the Coal Derrick, Ragsby's Reach, River Thames, has now undergone the following repairs.—*  
*Starboard side ahead bunker. One bulwark strake plate, and one plate in the stern strake plate renewed. One plate in the first strake below the stern strake removed, made fair & repaired, and one other plate in the same strake made fair in place. One plate in the second strake removed, made fair and replaced. And one plate in the bridge stern strake repaired. Stern frames and one reverse frame partly renewed. One main deck stringer plate and its angle iron made fair. One main deck angle iron beam and its knee plate repaired, and one other beam made fair.*
